

## CONFESSED

### To Robbing Dead After Testifying He Did Not.

Andrew Dellerman, aged 20, of Reading, will be before Coroner Schwab this morning to explain why he took a watch from the clothes of a dead man near Reading last Tuesday morning and then testified that no watch was found. Joseph Weis, another young man of the same village, will also be there.

The investigation is the outgrowth of the statement made by Fred Hafer. He passed along the railroad tracks near Reading just after Joseph Bittle, of Sharon, had been killed by a train, and avers that he saw two young men going through the dead man's clothes, which were scattered along the track. Yesterday Dellerman confessed to Coroner's Constable Haerr that he had taken the watch, but claimed that he had since turned it over to Deputy United States Marshal Dan Lawrence. Last Wednesday, however, he told the Coroner that no watch was found. It is claimed that Weis got a small sum of money at the same time that Dellerman secured the watch, but that young man could not be found yesterday. The watch in question is a valuable one, and is the property of Mrs. Bittle.
